

# **Statement of Purpose**

## Purpose / Specific Issues:

The Coalition to Protect Workers' Rights is a broad alliance of workers, civil rights, immigrant, faith, labor, community organizing, racial and environmental justice groups who believe that all workers in Massachusetts should be able to earn a decent wage, take care of their health, and protect against injury, harassment, and discrimination on the job. We oppose the \$100M+ campaign by Big Tech companies, including Uber, Lyft, DoorDash, and Instacart to undermine our law, as they recently did in California through Proposition 22, to exclude workers from basic rights and exempt themselves from the obligations of every other employer.

## **Ballot Question:**

We are opposed to an Uber/Big Tech-funded ballot measure to undermine our labor and civil rights laws, exempt multibillion dollar tech companies from the basic obligations of every other company in Massachusetts, including paying minimum wage, Social Security, and protections against workplace discrimination, and exploit app-based workers to further enrich tech giant executives.
