Who files the year-end report?

- 1. All office-holders, even if they did not appear on a ballot in 2020.
- 2. Former office-holders with balances or activity since their last report filed.
- 3. Unsuccessful candidates with balances or activity since their last report filed.
- 4. Existing ballot question committees. For example, a committee that organized in late 2020 in anticipation of a ballot question election in early 2021.
- 5. Any other committee organized with your office, such as municipal PACs.
