WHAT SHOULD A CLERK DO IF A CANDIDATE DID NOT FILE THE YEAR-END REPORT?

If a candidate or political committee failed to file the year-end report, due Jan. 20, a local election official may send a "10-day notice," informing the person to file within 10 days or they may be subject to fines of \$25 for each day it is late. The maximum fine is \$5,000.

Notices can be sent by e-mail or traditional mail.

If the form is not filed after 10 days, a clerk may refer that candidate to OCPF for potential fines.

Municipal candidates sometimes raise money by selling baked goods, hats and other merchandise, or by holding auctions. OCPF has also been asked if campaigns can "sell" the personal services of their volunteers. An example of services would be volunteers doing pedicures for a fee on their own time.

The primary rule is that each person who buys goods or services from a committee is a donor to the campaign, and the committee needs to collect his or her name and address.

ARE CANDIDATES FOR TOWN MEETING MEMBER REQUIRED TO FILE CAMPAIGN FINANCE REPORTS?

No. Those running for representative town meeting are not considered candidates for the purposes of the campaign finance law and are not required to file campaign finance reports.
