TOP 3 QUESTIONS ASKED BY TOWN & CITY CANDIDATES WHO FILE LOCALLY

1. Do I have to file campaign finance reports if I don't raise money for my campaign?

Answer: All candidates who appear on the ballot file campaign finance reports. If you spend your personal funds, those transactions are disclosed on campaign finance reports (see the next question). If you did not raise or spend money, please enter "zeros" on the report, then sign and submit it to the municipal clerk.

2. I ran for office in my town and spent my own personal funds. How do I report that activity?

Answer: You've made what we call "out-ofpocket" expenditures. You'll report the amount spent as a receipt, on Schedule A of the M102 campaign finance report. You'll also disclose the expenditure to the vendor on Schedule B. If it's a candidate loan, you'll list the expense as a liability (loan) to the candidate on Schedule D. <u>Click here</u> for a short tutorial on how to report out-of-pocket expenditures.

3. Do I need an EIN from the IRS to open a bank account?

Answer: According to federal tax laws and regulations, a political committee should obtain a federal tax ID to open a bank account. <u>Click here</u> for OCPF's instructions on how to obtain an EIN. <u>Click here</u> to access the IRS page for obtaining an EIN.
